




Automated External Defibrillator



CPR is as easy as



Compressions Push hard and fast on the center of the victim's chest

Airway back and lift the chin to open the airway

Breathing Tilt the victim's head Give mouth-to-mouth rescue breaths

Early chest compression can immediately circulate oxygen that is still in the bloodstream. By changing the sequence, chest compressions are initiated sooner and

CARDIAC ARREST VS. HEART ATTACK

People often use these terms interchangeably, but they are not the same.

CARDIAC ARREST occurs when the heart malfunctions and

stops beating unexpectedly Cardiac arrest is triggered by an electrical malfunction in the heart that causes an irregular heartbeat (arrhythmia). With its pumping action disrupted, the heart cannot pump blood

Cardiac arrest can be reversible in some victims if it's treated within a few minutes. First,

call your local emergency number and start CPR right away. Then, if an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) is available, use it as soon as possible.

If two people are available to help, one should begin CPR immediately while the other calls your local emergency number and finds an AED.

WHAT IS CARDIAC ARREST?

Cardiac arrest is A heart attack is

blood flow to the heart is blocked.

A blocked artery prevents oxygen-rich blood from reaching a section of the heart. If the blocked artery is not reopened quickly, the part of the heart normally nourished by that artery begins to die.

WHAT HAPPENS

Symptoms of a heart attack may be immediate and may include intense discomfort in the chest or other areas of the upper body, shortness of breath, cold sweats, and/or nausea/ vomiting. More often, though, symptoms start slowly and persist for hours, days or weeks before a heart attack. Unlike with cardiac arrest, the heart usually does not stop beating during a heart attack. The longer the person goes without treatment, the greater the damage.

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WHAT IS THE LINK? Most heart attacks do not lead to cardiac arrest. But when cardiac arrest occurs, heart attack is a common cause. Other conditions may also disrupt the heart's rhythm and lead to cardiac arrest. ambulance usually receive faster treat at the hospital, too














The heart attack symptoms in women can be different than men (shortness of breath, nausea/vomiting, and back or jaw pain).
